

Anthi Revithiadou, currently Assistant Professor of Linguistics (Phonology) at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, received her Ph.D. from Leiden University/HIL in 1999 (Ph.D. thesis: *Headmost Accent Wins*). Her research interests focus on phonological theory, the morphosyntax-phonology interface, language typology and language contact. She has also a profound interest in contact-induced systems and, especially, those varieties of Greek that have been in long-term contact with Turkish (e.g., Asia Minor Greek, Ofitika Pontic, Rhodian Muslim Greek, etc.). She has conducted 3 fieldwork trips in Nea Trapezounta on Ofitika Pontic (2003, 2006, 2009) and 3 fieldwork trips in Symi on Symi Greek (2002, 2006, 2007). In 2009 she received the *Studies 2009/ Μελέτες 2009* research grant (Project: *Ofitika Pontic: A Documentation Project with Special Emphasis on the Diachrony and Synchrony of the Dialect*, Funding ID 2128, URL: http://www.latsis-foundation.org/gr/32/anazhthsh_arxeiou_meleton.html) by the John S. Latsis Public Benefit Foundation. In 2008 she was awarded the Fulbright Research Grant (Fulbright Foundation, Athens) in order to carry our research on Ancient Greek stress at MIT (USA). She is a reviewer for international journals such as *Lingua* (Member of the Editorial Board since 2010), *Phonology*, *Natural Language and Linguistic Theory*, *The Linguistic Review*, *Journal of Greek Linguistics* (Member of the Editorial Board since 2009) and a reviewer for the *Linguistics Program* of the *National Science Foundation* (NSF, 2005, 2006, 2008, 2009). She has published 2 books, 36 articles in scientific journals, peer-reviewed volumes and proceedings. She presented her work in approx. 50 international conferences, workshops and colloquia and she was invited to present her work and give lectures at Universities in Europe and the USA. Since September 2010 she is the Project Leader of Action 5: *Reinforcement of the Mother Tongue* in the Program *Education of Immigrant and Repatriate Students* (Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, *Scientific Director*: Prof. Anna Anastassiadis-Symeonidis, URL: <http://www.diapolis.auth.gr/>, Funding IDs: 85705, 86040, 86041).
