

Anthi Revithiadou, currently Assistant Professor of Linguistics at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, received her Ph.D. from Leiden University/HIL in 1999. Her dissertation *Headmost Accent Wins* dealt with a group of lexical accent systems and developed a theory of accentuation that relied on the interaction of morphosyntactic principles with stress. Her research also extends to other areas of the morphosyntax-phonology interface. She is pursuing her work in the theoretical context of Optimality Theory, with emphasis on the structure of phonological representations and the issue of parallel grammars, and has published in journals (*Lingua*, *Journal of Greek Linguistics*) and edited volumes.
