The research conducted in the framework of the Program for the Education of Muslim Children aimed at "gathering and presenting the data on Minority education, identifying the special characteristics of this issue, and also conducting a thorough study about the fluency, or proficiency, level of Greek of Minority pupils in primary schools." Some of the basic goals of the project were: (a) to collect linguistic data of the process of acquiring Greek as a second language, (b) to assess language competence at all grammatical levels such as syntax, morphology, phonology, etc., and (c) to conduct research and write scientific reports on the acquisition of specific language phenomena, based on the quantitative and qualitative analysis of the data collected. I was involved in the latter action. More specifically, I organized the interviews as well as raw speech material of 24 pupils from seven minority primary schools of Thrace into a small corpus and, after carefully studying the compiled language material, I wrote a scientific report on the acquisition of super-segmental phonology and, especially, stress, phrasal phonology and intonation.
